

## MIDDLE SCHOOL COURSES

(Grades 6-8)

The LAUSD middle school summer program is for students who have just completed grades 6-8. A student is considered to be in the grade he/she just completed. The summer program is for students who are required or who have been recommended to attend summer school based upon their performance during the regular school year. The course offerings for middle school students include:

### Math Intervention

Students who enroll in this course will receive intense, skills-based instruction in the math elements expected to be mastered at each grade level. Class sizes will be small for optimum teacher-student interaction. Only students who are required or recommended for math remediation should enroll in these classes.

### Reading/Writing Intervention

Students who enroll in this course will receive intense, skills-based instruction in reading and writing. Students will work in small class sizes to master reading identification and comprehension, and writing skills. Only students who are required or strongly recommended for reading and/or writing remediation should enroll.

### Science/Social Science Make-up

This course is designed for students who have already taken 7 or 8 grade science or social studies and have failed one or more semester classes or have been strongly recommended to attend.

## HIGH SCHOOL COURSES

(Grades 9-12)

**\*Indicates a course that students who have just completed the eighth grade may take for high school credit. Students should know that the grades they receive in summer school, which are for high school credit, are permanently placed on their transcripts.**

High school courses are offered for both remediation and enrichment. Enrichment courses are tuition-based classes offered through LAUSD Education Foundation. The course descriptions listed next should explain who may enroll for the classes. Each of the following classes is **2 1/2 hours per day**. A student may enroll in either one or two of these classes; however, if a student enrolls in either one or two of these, he/she may not enroll in any class which is 5 hours long. **Sufficient enrollment is required for any class to occur. All classes will be held at Los Alamitos High School except Adult Education.**

### Make-up Classes

The following classes are for students who need to repeat a failing grade or improve a semester grade. **Students may not enroll in these classes for the purpose of getting ahead.** These courses run 2 1/2 hours per day for five weeks.

### **Language Skills 9 – 12 \* 5 credits**

This course is for students who 1) failed or want to improve a semester grade in English; 2) scored below proficient on the California Standards Test and want to improve their reading and writing skills; and 3) are English Learners (EL) and want to practice basic reading, writing and conversation skills in an English only setting. Read 180 curriculum is utilized in this course which involves computer based instruction along with direct instruction. This course meets high school graduation requirements but is not approved for UC/CSU credit.

### **English I Make-up 5 credits**

**This course is for students who failed or want to improve a semester grade in freshman English.**

**Composition 5 credits**  
This course is open only to students who complete grades 9- 11 in June. This is a UC - approved, college-prep course for students wishing to improve their writing skills. This course does not take the place of the required English classes during the school year. Although it is a more intensive course than English Make-up, students may register for this course to replace a failing grade.

**English II Make-up 5 credits**  
This course is for students who failed or want to improve a semester grade in sophomore English.

**English III Make-up 5 credits**  
This course is for students who failed or want to improve a semester grade in junior English.

**CAHSEE Prep English / Language Arts 5 credits**  
This course is designed to provide instruction for students who have not passed the English / Language Arts section of the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE). Sample questions will be infused into the course content.

**CAHSEE Prep Math 5 credits**  
This course is designed to provide instruction for students who have not passed the Math section of the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE). Sample questions will be infused into the course content.

**World History Make-up 5 credits**  
This course is for students who have failed or want to improve a semester grade in World History.

**U.S. History Make-up 5 credits**  
This course is for students who have failed or who want to improve a semester grade in U.S. History.

**Physical Universe Make-up 5 credits**  
This course is for students who have failed or who want to improve a semester grade in Physical Universe.

***Each of the following courses is 5 hours long. You may register for only one per semester***

**Biology Make-up 5 or 10 Credits**  
This course is only open to students who have already taken biology, but who want to improve their grade and/or skills. **This class will be held at Los Alamitos High School.**

**Algebra A Make-up 5 credits**  
**Algebra B Make-up 5 credits**  
**Algebra C Make-up 5 credits**  
**Algebra D Make-up 5 credits**

These classes are designed for students who have already taken it, but who want to improve their grade and/or skills before progressing to the next math class.

**Algebra I Make-up \* 5 or 10 credits**  
This class is designed for students who have already taken the course, but who want to improve their grade and/or skills before progressing to the next math class.

**Algebra II Make-up 5 or 10 credits**  
This class is designed for students who have already taken the course, but who want to improve their grade and/or skills before moving to advanced level math.

**Geometry Make-up 5 or 10 credits**  
This class is designed for students who have already taken the course, but who want to improve their grade and/or skills before progressing to the next math class.

## Enrichment Courses (Tuition-based Courses) offered by LAUSD Educational Foundation **Grades 8 – 12**

Tuition-based courses are offered through the Los Alamitos Unified School District Educational Foundation. **All of these courses will run 2 1/2 hours per day for five weeks unless noted. Tuition fee for each class is \$258.00, unless noted**

**3-D Design \* (Grades 8 – 12) 5 credits**  
**\$258.00**

Students receive fine arts graduation credit for this class. There is a small materials fee which needs to be paid when summer school starts. Students may only take one period of this course.

**Health Education-On-Line \* (Grades 8 – 12) 5 credits**  
**\$258.00**

This class fulfills the semester health requirement normally taken during the freshman year.

**Health Education-Classroom \* (Grades 8 – 12) 5 credits**  
**\$258.00**

This class fulfills the semester health requirement normally taken during the freshman year.

**Physical Education \* (Grades 8 -12) 5 credits**  
**\$258.00**

Students enrolling in this course will engage in a variety of physical education activities. Depending upon availability, some activities may take place off campus. Parent permission to travel is required for admission. Students may take two periods of this course for additional credit.

Adult Education (for students concurrently enrolled in high school)

\*Except for seniors who did not graduate with their class, students may not enroll in Adult Education classes that are available in regular summer school.

High school students may enroll in the Adult Education Summer Program by presenting concurrent enrollment form from their regular high school showing courses needed. Courses are structured so that students may work through an independent study format or complete course work during school hours. All tests are given at the school site. **This program is in session Tuesdays & Wednesdays in June and July from 5:00 - 8:00 P.M.**

# Attendance Policy

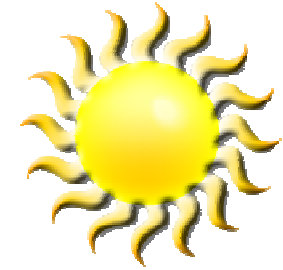
No credit will be given if student is absent more than two (2) days from class or one day from a semester class.
