Transitional Kindergarten Program

As you may already be aware, the California Kindergarten Readiness Act was signed into law in 2010. Under the law, by 2014, children must turn 5 years old on or before September 1 to enroll in a regular kindergarten (RK) program. For those “young fives” (children turning five between September 2 and December 2), districts have created a transitional kindergarten (TK) program to build a bridge between early learning and regular kindergarten. TK is defined as “the first year of a two-year kindergarten program that uses a modified kindergarten curriculum that is age and developmentally appropriate” (*Education Code* Section 48000[d]). The dates for students to participate in a TK program are listed below. Please note that students who have fall birthdates after the dates below will only be allowed to enroll in Transitional Kindergarten. Students with a birth date after December 2 should contact the district to discuss the limited options available, space permitting.

The State Eligibility Dates for Kindergarten:

- Child must turn five on or before Sept. 1

State Eligibility Dates for Transitional Kindergarten (TK):

- Child must turn five between Sept. 2 & Dec. 2

Please note that students who turn 5 years old in late spring or summer may also opt to enroll in the TK program based upon space availability.

What can I expect from a TK program?

TK is a modified kindergarten preparation program. It will introduce many of the skills needed for success to our younger students who will enter kindergarten the following year. In TK, teachers help children develop skills through activities that build confidence and communication. They also expose children to reading and math in exciting, interactive ways by using educational games to teach children about words and sentences and help them understand mathematical concepts like counting and patterns.

Quick Facts

TK is a two-year kindergarten program: Transitional Kindergarten (TK) is year one and regular kindergarten is year two.

- The TK curriculum directly connects to and supports the regular kindergarten curriculum.
- TK teachers support math, literacy, and language development.
- TK teachers help students develop social and communication skills.
- Students benefit from academic and enrichment activities like art and drama.
- TK teachers are fully credentialed.
- TK students’ instructional day is the same hours as regular kindergarten.
