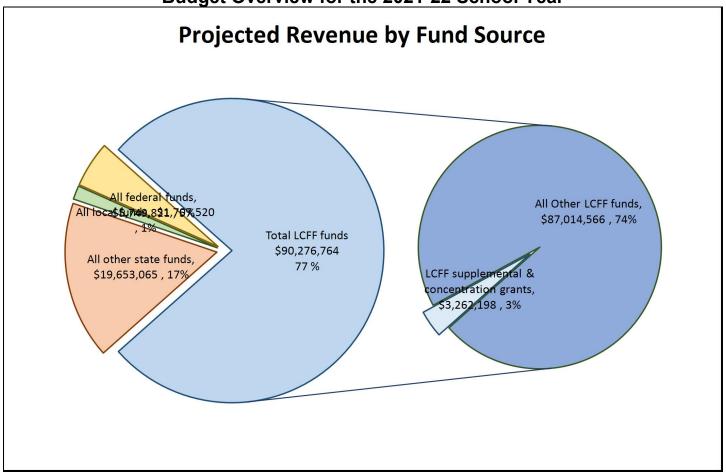

LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).





This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Los Alamitos Unified School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Los Alamitos Unified School District is \$117,387,170, of which \$90,276,764 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$19,653,065 is other state funds, \$1,707,520 is local funds, and \$5,749,821 is federal funds. Of the \$90,276,764 in LCFF Funds, \$3,262,198 is

generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

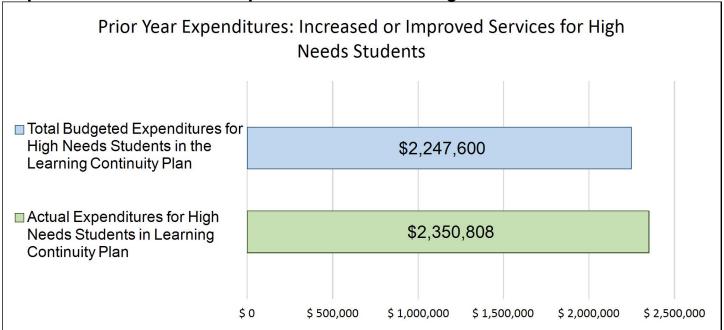
# Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2021-22 School Year

In 2021-22, Los Alamitos Unified School District is projecting it will receive \$3,262,198 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students.
