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Griffin Connections

- History Social Science courses offered for graduation credit: World History, US History and Government/Economics (AP Courses are not offered during the summer.)
- Remote learning environment: 95% independent online learning/5%
 Zoom classroom learning.
- Created in response to a need for students to create room in their schedule for the upcoming school year. (*Prioritized for students with a 6-period day next school year.*)
- Free classes designed for students who are self-motivated and independent learners interested in taking an accelerated course.



95% Independent Online Learning 5% Zoom Classroom Learning

- All A-G approved courses, taught by Los Al Unified teachers and delivered through APEX Learning.
- The curricular demands of the courses will <u>NOT</u> allow students to rapidly complete a semester or leave the bulk of their work until the end of the course.
- Course structure will include weekly check-in points. Therefore, the expectation of completing curriculum will be scaffolded into demands that must be completed and turned in weekly on assigned dates.
- Daily student commitment is anticipated to be 3-4 hours per day.
- Must have access to wi-fi and log into Pacific Standard Time for zoom class.



Summer Courses

95% Independent Online Learning 5% Zoom Classroom Learning

Full year course will be taught in two, 3-week semesters: (STUDENTS MUST TAKE BOTH SEMESTERS)

- Semester I: June 12 June 30
 - Mandatory IN-PERSON Learning Day: June 12
 - Mandatory Zoom Classroom Learning Days: June 20, June 27

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- Semester II: July 10 July 28
 - Mandatory Zoom Learning Days: July 11, July 18, July 25
- Live ZOOM class meeting days are 2 hours in length.
- Students are <u>REQUIRED</u> to attend one in-person classroom day and two Zoom sessions for Semester I and three Zoom sessions for Semester II. Students will <u>NOT</u> receive credit for a semester if they miss more than one day of classroom learning. (Office hours could be used for a make-up of the seat time for one absence.)

Summer Course Required APEX Course Readiness Module

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 To give students a foundational understanding and initial experience with the APEX, the e-learning platform, students <u>MUST</u> attend one, hour-long course zoom learning session:

Friday, April 7 at 4:00 PM
Monday, April 17 at 4:30 PM
Wednesday, April 19 at 5:30 PM
Friday, April 21 at 7:15 AM
Saturday, April 22 at 9:00 AM

Summer Courses

- Open virtual support hours via email, phone call, Google meet/hangout, Zoom, etc..
- Students can directly reach out to their teacher for support.
- Teachers will communicate the best way to setup support on the first day of Semester I.



Summer 2023 Offerings

- Incoming 10th Grade Students
 - World History
- Incoming 11th Grade Students
 - US History
- Incoming 12th Grade Students
 - Government & Economics

Students are able to select their preference for a class time, however number of classes offered and assignment of class time is based upon student demand and instructor availability. *Other than the one in-person classroom day and the ZOOM learning sessions students may choose to work and complete assignments online at any time, week-by-week.



The *Griffin Connections Self-Survey* has been completed and we are in mutual agreement that an online course is a good or great fit. (*Student did not receive a "D" or "F" in English Semester 1*) We understand that there is ONE mandatory in-person classroom day (June 12) and weekly mandatory Zoom learning sessions, each two hours in length, and that if a student misses more than one mandatory day per semester, they will <u>NOT</u> receive credit for the course. Mandatory days are (June 12, June 20, June 27, July 11, July 18, July 25). (Traveling and/or lack of wi-fi access is not excusable.) - We have been notified of the Semester drop deadlines:
 - Semester I: Friday, June 16, 2023
 - Semester II: Friday, July 14, 2023

Steps to Register

- Based on student demand of courses it will be determined if a student lottery is required.
- Lottery will be a random selection of students who turn in a Summer 2023 Course Intent Form by <u>March 3</u>.
- Students will be notified of registration status by March 10.
- Registration packets will be available for students who secure a seat and will be due by <u>March 17</u>. Students who don't return registration packets by <u>March 17</u> will lose their seat in the summer course and the course will be filled from the waitlist.



Steps to Register

- Students who don't secure a seat in the class will be placed on a waiting list.
- All open seats in a course will be filled in the order registration forms are received <u>after March 17</u>.

Things to Be Aware of ...

- Courses taken through Griffin Connections will appear on a student's permanent transcript. Summer courses are no different than a course taken during the school year.
- Be highly-engaged throughout the course paying close attention to semester <u>drop dates</u> and reach out to the instructor as soon as possible with questions or concerns.

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Things to Be Aware of ...

- Courses taken from an outside institution to meet graduation requirements require written approval. (LAHS Assistant Principal of Academics, Mr. Platt)
- Students can't be concurrently enrolled in Griffins Connections and another <u>public</u> educational agency that receives ADA funding. (Therefore, a student cannot enroll in Griffin Connections for one summer course and another public education entity for a different course. Example - A student can't take one course with Griffin Connections and one with Pacific Coast High School during the same summer.)
