TIER 3

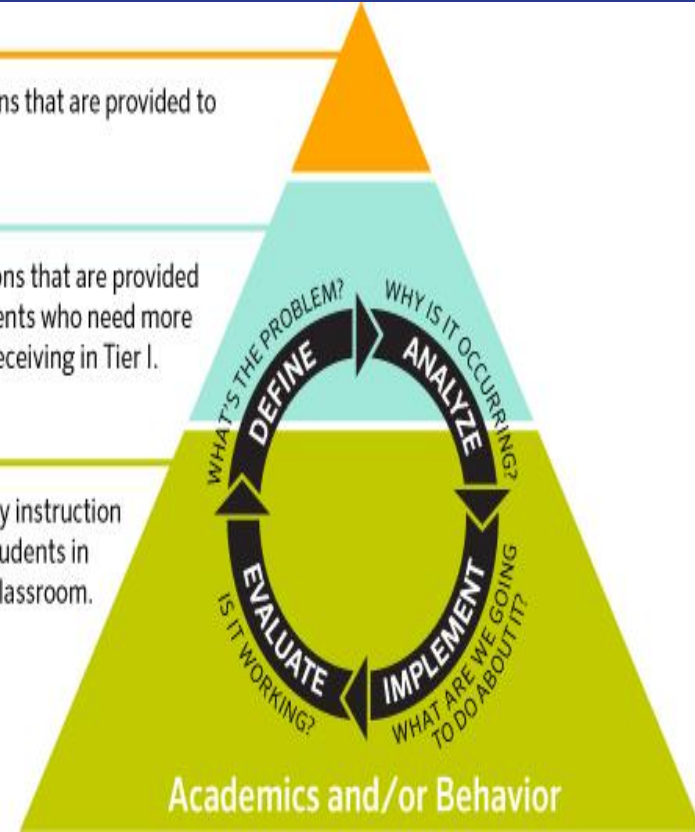
refers to the interventions that are provided to individual students.
